

Nampa golf Commission Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order: at 9:02 AM by Commission Chairman Scott Jacobsen

Minutes: Motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the minutes of 4/17/18

Revenue & Expense Reports: John Lewis indicated that April revenue for Centennial was up from last year and the course has been very busy. Scott Nicholes indicated that Ridgecrest has also been busy and hosted several corporate events last month. Darrin Johnson indicated that expenses for both courses have been normal for this time of year. Motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the revenue and expense reports.

Operations Reports: Charlie Denham reported for Centennial that there is a sprinkler problem on number 3 that involves rust getting into the line and clogging heads that have to be dug up and cleaned, taking a lot of time. This problem has also slowed down planned re-sodding of #4 tee. He is continuing to try to find the source of the problem to try to correct it. Charlie also reported aeration was completed on both courses and went well. Toilet seats have also been replaced in both restrooms. Scott Jacobsen received a report for Ridgecrest from Clayton Dye that the course is looking good and the greens are recovering nicely from aeration just 6 days ago. This required a lot of work from a short-handed crew and they did an excellent job.

Public Relations Reports: Linda Estes reported for Centennial that a high school match was held on 4/18, the CMGA league began on 4/19 with 44, 2-man teams. Boise Blast hosted a 30-team tournament on 4/21 and the Ladies Area Travel Team held a match on 4/24. The IGA course rating was done on 4/26 and the Elks League began on 4/30. The Mayor's Tournament was held on 5/4 with a full field of 32 teams, followed by an Idaho Power event in the afternoon. A US Kids tournament was held on 5/5 and a Links Golfers group event was held on 5/7 with 9 groups. A 5A Division girls Varsity and Jr. Varsity tournament was held on 5/8 followed by a boys 5A Division tournament on 5/9. Kiwanis hosted an event on 5/11 with 19 groups, and the Mechem Tournament was held on 5/12 with a full field. Green aeration was performed on 5/14. An interview panel is currently interviewing for the open Course Superintendent position. June York reported for Ridgecrest that a Columbia High School tournament was held on 4/17 with 24 players on the championship course and 16 on the Wee Nine. A foot golf outing was held on 4/18 with 34 players. The Veterans Golf Assoc. held an event on 4/21 with 32 players and a Jackson's Energy event was held on 4/24 with 100 players. Rocky Mountain PGA Section held Player's Ability Tests for 7 participants on 4/26 and getting Golf Ready 1 started the first of 6 weekly events on 5/1 with 16 participants. The Idaho Bankers Assoc. held an event on 5/2 with 36 players and on 5/3 a pro-clinic was held for Ridgecrest Ladies Assoc. where Tim and Tom graciously gave their time to instruct 28 players on chipping, putting, sand shots and driving range tips. The Ridgecrest Men's Assoc. held a 2-man scramble on 5/5 with 36 players. At least 170 youngsters participated in Drive/Chip/Putt on 5/6 which also generated good sales in the Pro-Shop as well as concessions. On 5/10 the Executive Women's Golf Assoc. started the

first of 6 weeks of instruction with Tim Bensley. Motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the Operations and Public Relations reports.

Mayor's Tournament: Financials from the Mayor's Tournament were reviewed and discussed. In addition to the seven \$2000.00 scholarships awarded at the tournament, and has been customary in recent years, motion was made, seconded and passed to award \$1000.00 to the Mayor's Teen Council and \$1000.00 to Centennial for hosting the tournament. Money raised from teams and sponsors completely covered the scholarships and awards. The Commission also discussed the Mayor's Tournament scholarship online application form and decided that it needs to be revised. A copy will be distributed to Commission members for input on necessary revisions, and those will be discussed at the June meeting.

Pepsi Scholarships: Six applications were received for reduced-fee youth passes, all for Centennial. After review and discussion motion was made, seconded and passed to approve all six applications.

Yearly Election of Officers: Motion was made, seconded and passed to elect Scott Jacobsen as Chairman. Motion was made, seconded and passed to elect Steve Wilson as Secretary. Motion was made, seconded and passed to elect June York as Vice Chairman.

Adjournment: Motion was made, seconded and passed to adjourn the meeting at 10:02 AM.
