

Nampa's sign regulations are found in Chapter 10.23 of the Nampa Municipal Code. This brochure summarizes the regulations for temporary signs.

Standards address when and for how long temporary signs may be displayed, sign location, the number of signs, size, height, and sign design.

1. A maximum of one (1) temporary sign may be displayed according to Table 10-23-19 (A).
2. All temporary signs must be professionally made, be weath-

erproof and kept in a state of good appearance, safety, and repair. No broken, unsightly, inferior, faded, ripped, or worn materials may be utilized.

3. Temporary signs shall be self-supporting so as to remain in an upright position.
4. All temporary signs shall be located on private property; however, no signs shall be placed within any landscaping strips that are maintained by the City of Nampa.
5. All temporary signs shall be spaced a minimum of five (5') away from any other temporary or permanent sign, except for fence banners, which shall be spaced a minimum of ten (10') from any other temporary or permanent sign.

Temporary signs in the public right-of-way in violation of the standards of the code will be removed by the City of Nampa and may be discarded. Violators of the sign code are subject to citation and fines.

<sup>1</sup>Temporary signs shall be spaced a minimum of 5' from any other temporary or permanent sign. Temporary signs on fences may be spaced a minimum of 10' from any other temporary or permanent sign.

<sup>2</sup>Temporary signs for subdivisions refers to signage located at the entrance to subdivisions or to model homes.

<sup>3</sup> During the period of time when realty is offered for sale, lease or exchange, the sign shall not exceed three (3) square feet and shall not exceed a maximum height of three (3') feet.

<sup>4</sup> See Section 10-23-18 for signs utilized during construction. Signs utilized as construction signs can be temporary monument and/or freestanding signs.
